## Survey Methodology

Howard Initiative on Public Opinion designed and administered this multi-modal survey. The survey reached 1,000 adults, age 18 or older, who self-identified as African American or Black and indicated they were registered to vote in Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, or Wisconsin. 963 respondents indicated they are almost certain to vote, will probably vote, or the chances are 50-50 that they will vote in the election for president, Congress, and local offices in November. The survey was conducted September 4 - 11, 2024, via live phones with trained operators and online via a link from a SMS.

The sample was randomly selected from a national voter file. Thirty-nine percent of respondents were reached on telephones (Total weighted: 39 percent; Likely voters weighted: 37 percent). Ninety percent of the respondents who took the survey via phone were reached on a wireless phone (Total weighted: 89 percent; Likely voters weighted: 92 percent). Sixty-one percent were reached via SMS and took the survey online (Total weighted: 62 percent; Likely voters weighted: 63 percent).

Quotas were assigned to reflect the demographic distribution of registered African American/Black voters in the presidential battleground, defined as Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin. The data were weighted by gender; age; predictive model scores for turnout, partisanship, and high school education only; and region by state to ensure an accurate reflection of the population.

The margin of error for the total data is +/- 3.1% and the margin of error for likely voters is +/- 3.2%. The margin of error for subgroups is larger and varies. Percentage totals may not add up precisely due to rounding.
