Lorenzo Morris is professor emeritus and former chair of Political Science at Howard University. He held the Tocqueville-Fulbright Distinguished Chair at the University of Paris. He taught previously at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He has been a Research Fellow at the Brookings Institution and at other institutes. He has served as a lecturer and analyst on voting behavior and rights in numerous countries. He is an author and consultant on electoral behavior, survey analysis, black politics, and public policy. He has provided frequent television, radio and newspaper commentary on public affairs in the U.S. and abroad. He has published five scholarly books and more than a hundred fifty articles. He has held offices in numerous professional associations including the American Political Science Association and the National Conference of Black Political Scientists, as its president. He is the former chair of the Howard University Faculty Senate. He directed the Census Information Center, the Community Development Minor, Phi Beta Kappa and other academic programs at Howard. Born in Poughkeepsie, NY, he received his B.A. from Fisk University and his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in political science from the University of Chicago.
